MAIN POINT:

The poverty of the Christians at Smyrna was extensive; they were economically destitute similar to many churches across the world today, yet Jesus says they were spiritually rich (v. 2:9). "Listen, My beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which He has promised to those who love Him? ... James 2:5, (ESV)

What can we learn from this ...?

- 1. How does the Letter to the Church of Ephesus (Taught by Troy Last Week) share a similar structure to this letter?
- 2. Jesus describes Himself to the church as "the first and the last, who died and came to life."
 - Why would this description be particularly meaningful to the church in Smyrna?
 - Read *Matthew 10:28-33* to help answer the question.
- 3. What does He mean when He refers to their being "rich in the midst of poverty"?
 - How does 2Corinthians 6:10 and James 2:5 shed light on this?

4. How would these verses encourage you in the midst of tough times?

2. Which attributes of God most comfort you in the midst of trials and why?

- 3. Have you experienced suffering in your life where it was difficult for a time to stand firm?
- How did you handle the situation?
- 4. Most of us don't compromise in our faith. Yet, we compromise for far less than that. In which areas of life do you think Christian men most feel the pressure to compromise, and where does that pressure come from?
