1. The Church in Laodicea...God's Final Word to a Diabolical Strategy

- The Church in Ephesus...a Love left behind (internal opposition) ... AD 33-100
- The Church in <u>Smyrna</u>...Trials and Persecution (external opposition) ...AD 100-312
- The Church in <u>Pergamos</u>...Their trap of Compromise (lowering standards) ...AD 312-600, to today
- The Church in <u>Thyatira</u>...Corrupt Tolerance (allowing sin) ...AD 600-1517, to today
- The Church in <u>Sardis</u>...Spiritually Dead (relied on reputation from the past) ...1600 post Reformation-today
- The Church in <u>Philadelphia</u>...Faithful (trusting the Lord in everything, no matter what!) ...1700/1800-today
- The Church in Laodicea...Lukewarm (self-reliant, no need for God except in name) ...later 1900-today

Scripture: Revelation 3:19-20, Lamentations 3:21-25, Jeremiah 29:11-14, 2Chronicles 7:14, John 14:27

1. Why do you think that we, as people, are so naturally drawn to a "Lukewarm" relationship with God?

2. What does a *"Lukewarm"* life and attitude say to God regarding our Mindset (*the condition of our heart, how we think, and what we believe*) toward the Love, Grace, and New Life that the Lord Jesus offers us and gave His life for us to have?

(READ <u>Ephesians 2:1-10</u> and John 3:16-17 as a reminder of what He has done for us)

3. Looking at the brief description of each of the 7-Churches (*page #1*), which one(s) do you most identify with, and why?

4. READ <u>Revelation 3:20</u>, John 14:15-18, John 14:27, John 15:4-5, John 15:11, Lamentations 3:21-25, Jeremiah 29:11-14, and <u>2Chronicles 7:14</u> together...

In what ways do these verses strengthen your Faith and Trust in the Lord, and cause you to walk in confidence that He is always with you in every situation?

• What action will you take to strengthen and maintain your commitment to be "All-In" with your decision to faithfully live as a follower of the Lord Jesus?
