**1.** The enemy wants to do all he can to distort how we live out who we are and how we define success. He wants to keep us "off aim" so we miss how God wants to work in us and through us in whatever circumstances we find ourselves. As we heard in this message, the Apostle Paul helped the Philippians "keep their aim" in the midst of life's challenges.

READ *Philippians 4:4-8*, and circle three things that catch your attention and will help you "find your aim" in 2021.

## Philippians 4:4-8 (NIV)...

<sup>4</sup> Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!

<sup>5</sup> Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near.

<sup>6</sup> Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

<sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

*<sup>8</sup>* Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

**2.** As followers of Jesus, the Holy Spirit is changing us from the inside out. <u>*Galatians 5:22-23*</u> reveals to us the fruit of the Spirit.

## Galatians 5:22-23 (NIV)

<sup>22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,
<sup>23</sup> gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.
