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The days in which we live are filled with crisis and confusion, chaos, and fear. There is much pressure to "go along, to get along," and if you don't there will be consequences! In fact, Jude, the brother of Jesus, only awakened from "great deception" himself, after Jesus had resurrected from the tomb.

Jude's letter encourages and challenges the Church of today, even as he encouraged and challenged the first Church generation. Verse 3 of Jude's letter shows the desperation of his heart, "...although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith..."

His letter instructs and exhorts us to be "wise as serpents and gentle as doves" (Matthew 10:16) "for such a time as this" (Esther 4:14). Solomon said long before Jude, "there is nothing new under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 1:9). Jude's letter gives clear warning of the "times we are facing" and how we are to respond.

We are daughters of the King. We must bring everything that surrounds us, no matter the pressure to bow or the comfort to go along, back to the truth of the unchanging Word!

This Word alone is the sword of the Spirit. It is alive and sharper than any two-edged sword, dividing between soul and spirit and the thoughts and intents of the hearts. We are to build ourselves up in our most holy faith, praying in the Spirit with all kinds of prayers. With the Word and prayer, we will be able to reach out with compassion and truth to those who doubt!


We are living in times of tribulation, fear, and doubt, but Jesus promised "be of good cheer, I have overcome the World" (John 16:33). Jude's letter will encourage, strengthen, teach, equip and encourage us to remember that Jesus has made us more than conquerors (Romans 8:37).

Jude's letter is our invitation to make our salvation sure, walking by His light, even in the midst of dark shadows. We will be blessed!

a few helpful reminders....

- We will be working from the English Standard Version for the scripture portions.
- Remember to begin your time in the Word with prayer asking to see, hear, believe, while responding to the voice of the Father.
- All of these bullets are prompts to help you see, hear, and respond to the voice of the Lord as you read His Word.
- Partnering with at least one other person gives you a prayer partner and an accountability partner; someone you can minister to and hold up in prayer and encouragement, as they hold you up.
- Read the complete chapter each week as we study through portions of Hebrews. This will give you context for the chosen portion of scripture you will be considering as you learn how to "walk prophetically" through Hebrews.



<sup>*8*</sup> Yet in like manner these people also, relying on their dreams, defile the flesh, reject authority, and blaspheme the glorious ones. <sup>*9*</sup> But when the archangel Michael, contending with the devil, was disputing about the body of Moses, he did not presume to pronounce a blasphemous judgment, but said, "The Lord rebuke you." <sup>*10*</sup> But these people blaspheme all that they do not understand, and they are destroyed by all that they, like unreasoning animals, understand instinctively. <sup>*11*</sup> Woe to them! For they walked in the way of Cain and abandoned themselves for the sake of gain to Balaam's error and perished in Korah's rebellion. <sup>*12*</sup> These are hidden reefs at your love feasts, as they feast with you without fear, shepherds feeding themselves; waterless clouds, swept along by winds; fruitless trees in late autumn, twice dead, uprooted; <sup>*13*</sup> wild waves of the sea, casting up the foam of their own shame; wandering stars, for whom the gloom of utter darkness has been reserved forever.

<sup>14</sup> It was also about these that Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied, saying, "Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of his holy ones, <sup>15</sup> to execute judgment on all and to convict all the ungodly of all their deeds of ungodliness that they have committed in such an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things that ungodly sinners have spoken against him." <sup>16</sup> These are grumblers, malcontents, following their own sinful desires; they are loud-mouthed boasters, showing favoritism to gain advantage.

<sup>17</sup> But you must remember, beloved, the predictions of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup> They said to you, "In the last time there will be scoffers, following their own ungodly passions." <sup>19</sup> It is these who cause divisions, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit. <sup>20</sup> But you, beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit, <sup>21</sup> keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life. <sup>22</sup> And have mercy on those who doubt; <sup>23</sup> save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh.

<sup>24</sup> Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy, <sup>25</sup> to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.
