# Walking Prophetically

Preparing for the Bridegroom



Our prayer as we begin preparing for the Bridgeroom

"Oh Most Holy God, our Father, thank you for your only begotten Son, Jesus. Abba, you have betrothed us to Him. Jesus is our Bridegroom! "As a husband loves His wife, Jesus loves His Church (His Bride), giving Himself up for her, so that He might sanctify her, cleansing her by the washing of water with the Word, that He might present to Himself the Church (His Bride) in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle ... but that she would be holy and blameless."

Father God, we long to "make ourselves ready...to clothe ourselves with fine linen, bright and pure ... the righteous deeds of the saints." Open the eyes of our hearts to "see;" to know the hope to which our Bridegroom Jesus has called us, the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints." "Open our ears that we hear what your Spirit says to the Church (His Bride) "

Make us ready to respond with joyful obedience as a testimony of our love. Our Bridegroom exhorts us, "Maranatha, Jesus is coming quickly."

Ephesians 5:26, Revelation 19:7,8, Ephesians 1;15-18, Revelation 3:22, Revelation 22:7, 1Corinthians 16;24

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"Blow the trumpet in Jerusalem!... Call the people together.... Call the bridegroom from his quarters and the bride from her private room" (Joel 2:15–16, NLT). A royal wedding is announced by the sound of trumpets, and the wedding is blessed under the traditional canopy.

Marriages in ancient Israel were arranged by parents, like Abraham did for his son Isaac. Typically the bridegroom would go to the house of the bride-to-be (sometimes their first meeting) and bring three things: the wedding contract, a skin of wine, and the bride price. After the father approved the bride price, the young man would present his vows of love. A glass of wine would be poured, and the betrothal contract then became a legal document, a ketubah. The couple's status changed to betrothed, and they were legally married, though the wedding ceremony was still some time away.

With all the transactions completed, the groom took his betrothed aside to tell her that he was going away to build their bridal chamber. When the chamber was finished, he would return for her. Who decides when the chamber is ready? The groom tells his bride that he does not know exactly when the wedding will begin. Only his father determines the day and hour (see Mark 13:32). This is when the bride begins the wait for the day when her groom will come to capture her. She is confident of his return for two reasons: the vows he pledged and the price he paid. Meanwhile, she wears a veil to signify that she is taken.

She receives regular progress reports about her new home. The foundation is laid. The walls are up. The doors are hung. Now the roof! Her excitement grows. Any day her beloved will come. She gathers her closest friends, and they begin watching through the night, two by two, waiting to hear the shouts of young men as they race toward her father's home (see Matthew 25:6–7). This gives her just minutes to wake up, ready to be "raptured" from her own home. Traditionally the Jewish father waited until the middle of the night, when his son was fast asleep and tired from all his hard work. I can picture the proud father gently shaking his son and whispering, "It's time." Time to claim his bride.

When Jesus told His disciples, "If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself" (John 14:3), He was giving the speech of a Jewish bridegroom. He paid the ultimate bride price. "Knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold...but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot" (1 Peter 1:18–19).

He gives us our ketubah (our contract) through the promises in His Word, and He invites us to the most glorious wedding that will ever take place (Revelation 19:7–9). "Blessed are those who are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!" (verse 9).

Now we worship — spending time in intimate prayer. This is our response to all that the Holy Spirit is revealing of our bridegroom, our future and our sure hope. "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, to give you a hope and future." Jeremiah 29:11

As a virgin bride we watch — active in being a witness and testimony of our bridegroom. "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you." 

Lesson One

Revelation 1

Your Bridegroom

Revelation Chapter One Lesson 1

Begin with Prayer- Take a few minutes to settle yourself before the Lord. Ask the Holy Spirit to open the eyes of your heart and mind to see and hear what the Word of the Lord is revealing to you. Confess anything that would hinder you from hearing, seeing or obeying the Holy Spirit as you prepare for the Bridegroom.

- I. Share with your group: all that you are asking the Holy Spirit to do to prepare you for the Bridegroom.
- II. Read all of Revelation chapter 1: this is very important to get flow and context.

# Revelation Chapter 1:1-9,17-19 *Your Bridegroom*

"The revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show to His servants the things that must soon take place. He made it known by sending His angel to His servant John, who bore witness to the Word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that He saw. Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed, are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near.

John to the seven churches that are in Asia; Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the Seven Spirits who are before His throne, and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth.

To Him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by His blood, and made us a kingdom, priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. Behold, He is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of Him. Even so, Amen. I am the Alpha and the Omega, says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty. I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos on account of the Word of God and the testimony of Jesus..."

When I saw Him (Jesus), I fell at His feet as though dead. But He laid His right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last., and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this..."

III. Re-read this portion of scripture: As you read, focus on what you "see and hear" in this scene.






## What do I SEE?

SEEING....(The Logos Word). This is recording the general facts that everyone sees. Yours may be a little different than another's but you all will be working from the same passage.

Who is this revelation written about and why was it written?

Describe what stands out to you most about your Bridegroom.

- Who is John and what is promised?
- Who is John writing to?
- How is the trinity made known in this revelation?
- What is John's testimony of brotherhood in vs.9
- What is the testimony Jesus gave of Himself to John and how did this strengthen Him?

## What do I HEAR?

HEARING...(The Rhema Word) This is a personal word you hear the Holy Spirit speaking to you from this portion of Scripture. Listen for the whisper of the Holy Spirit to your Spirit. It is a call to obedience and worship; called Revelation.

- How do the first 3 verses resonate in your Spirit? The Holy Spirit is your teacher and counselor.
- Listen as you read slowly vs.4-6, giving testimony, exalting in the Father and Spirit. How he gives witness of who Jesus is in the world and in believers' lives. All this because John had a personal, life-giving relationship with Jesus. How do you give witness in your relationship with Jesus?
- What do you hear in vs. 7-9? Does it bring you anticipation or fear?
- Listen and record the personal encouragement and exhortation as you hear what the Spirit is saying in vs.17-19



Write down your reactions and responses to what you saw and heard. Re-read your
response to seeing & hearing. This may prompt a remembrance of a song or an experience you have had or maybe evoke personal meditations in what it says and how it affects you in the midst of the circumstances of your life. This is called fellowshipping in the Spirit – engaging your
senses; your spirit responding to the moving of the Holy Spirit – taking the Word to your own heart, life and spirit.



Because you are seeing and hearing what the Holy Spirit is impressing on your spirit, you now must choose to respond ... or not. Believing is moving from Logos (knowledge of the general Word) to Rhema (hearing the living, confronting, revealing personal Word to you); Choosing to ctively live out, by faith, what you see and hear, by your obedience.

# Believing always leads to action.

Obedience is Radical Discipleship...it's what Jesus did. Because this is what I saw and heard the Lord say, I will respond by obeying His revealed will to me.

Take a moment to review Seeing and Hearing. Reread your Journal page. Now you're ready to write down your commitment to obediently walk out the revelation of the Holy Spirit. Is it forgiving someone or ...receiving forgiveness for yourself? Confessing a sinful pattern or weakness. Walking in faith to testify of Jesus to someone in word or deed? Taking a special action of obedience in some practical way?

•	From this scripture portion what has the Holy Spirit revealed to you? What practical action are you committed to take because of this portion of scripture?		



Take some time and pray with a partner or two. Pray about what the Holy Spirit has revealed to you and HOW you have committed to take personal action on it.


Praying together – committing to pray for one another – gives you support and makes you accountable to one another before the throne of God.

- Begin with praise and worship as John did recognizing and worshipping the Lord.
- Surrender your will to the will of the Holy Spirit in all He has revealed
- Remember and worship who God is, who the Holy Spirit is, and who Jesus is in and through your life.
- Repent of anything that keeps you from being a testifier of God's plan; Jesus in you, your hope of glory! Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you up to be Jesus radical disciple.
- Give thanks for what the Holy Spirit has revealed and how God has been faithful in the past, written how Jesus is your Savior, and how you will live by "it is written."

l esson Two

Revelation 2:1-17

Your Bridegroom- Who holds the Seven Stars... Who has the Sharp Two-Edged Sword... Pevelation Chapter Two
Lesson 2

Begin with Prayer- Quiet your heart and mind from all the distractions and give your full attention to spending time with the Holy Spirit. Put away phones, and anything else that will distract for this time. Bring your thoughts into captivity by setting each worry and every "to do" down at the foot of the cross. Ask the Holy Spirit to open the eyes of your heart to see and hear what the Spirit is saying to you.

- Share with your group: Share how you are making yourself ready to meet the Ι. Bridegroom!How you have exercised what you truly believe by what you have been obedient to do.
- II. Read Revelation chapter 2: We will be taking portions of the first three letters to the churches to hear the message that the Holy Spirit has for us to see and hear and believe.

# **Revelation Chapter 2:1-17**

# Your Bridegroom Who holds the Seven Stars...Who has the Sharp Two-Edged Sword...

Revelation 2:1, 3-5,7: Church of Ephesus- "The words of Him who holds the seven stars in His right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands. I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for My Name's Sake, and you have not grown weary. But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the works you did at first..." to the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God."

Revelation 2: 8-11: Church of Smyrna- "The words of the first and the last, who died and came to life. I know your tribulation and your poverty (but you are rich) and the slander of those who say that they are Jews (believers) and are not but are a synagogue of Satan. Do not fear what you are about to suffer...you will be tested...you will have tribulation. Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life...The one who conquers will not be hurt by the second death."

Revelation 2: 12-17: Church of Pergamum- "The words of Him who has the sharp two-edged sword. I know where you dwell, where Satan's throne is. Yet you hold fast My Name, and you did not deny My faith, even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells. But I have a few things against you; you have some who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality...some hold the teaching of the Nicolaitans... Repent. To the one who conquers I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give a white stone, with a new name written on the stone that no one knows except the one who receives it."

III. Re-read the entire chapter – paying close attention to the portions of scripture – the letters – on what you see and hear in these letters that speaks to you.



# Walking Prophetically-Preparing for the Bridegroom




## What do I SEE?

SEEING....(The Logos Word). **This is recording the general facts that everyone sees.** Yours may be a little different than another's but you all will be working from the same facts of the passage. Refer back to the scripture portions for clarity...

- Describe the distinguishing characteristics of the Bridegroom in the 3 letters.
- What good things did the Lord applaud each church about?
- · What accusations did the Lord have for each church?
- What is the warning for each church?

What is the promise for each church?

#### What do I HEAR?

HEARING....(The Rhema Word) This is the word spoken personally to you by the Holy Spirit from this portion of Scripture. **Each of us is the Church! Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you how these letters speak personally to you.** It is a call to repentance, obedience and promise. Revelation happens as we submit to the Holy Spirit.

- How do you describe Jesus? (remember you can refer back chapter 1) He is your Bridegroom.
- What do you hear about your personal walk with the Lord when reading these letters? When He gives affirmations of good deeds and faithfulness?
- What do you hear about your personal walk with the Lord when reading these letters? When He admonishes about sinful patterns and falling short?
- How are you moved by His exhortation to repent?
- How are you encouraged by His promises about conquering?

•	What is the Holy Spirit revealing to you about your walk of faith and love as you prepare for you Heavenly Bridegroom?



This is a personal time to reflect and respond to what you have seen and heard. Take time to consider and reflect. Writing helps to see what is in your heart. This is called fellowshipping with the Holy Spirit – revealing our hearts.



The Holy Spirit has given you revelation as you read and consider the scriptures, and now... you must choose to respond... or not. We need to be intentional...JESUS WAS. Believing is moving from Logos (knowledge of the general Word) to Rhema (hearing the living, confronting, revealing, personal Word to you); Actively living out, in faith, what you see and hear from the Holy Spirit, by your obedience.

Obedience is Radical Discipleship. That's what following Jesus requires. Because this is what you saw and heard the Lord say, you choose to respond by acting in obedience to His revealed will to you.

Take a moment to review Seeing and Hearing. Reread your Journal page. **Now you're ready to write down your commitment to obediently walk out the revelation of the Holy Spirit.** Is it forgiving someone or... yourself? Confessing a sinful pattern or weakness. Walking in faith to testify of Jesus to someone? Taking a practical action in serving or...acting?

- How do you relate to the letters to the Churches? What has the Holy Spirit revealed to you?
- What personal, practical action are you committed to take by the prompting of the Holy Spirit.



Now take some time and pray with a partner or two. Pray about what the Holy Spirit has revealed to you and HOW you have committed to take personal action on it.

Praying together – committing to pray for one another – gives you support and makes you accountable to one another before the throne of God.


- Praise the Lord of heaven and earth for His love, mercy and longsuffering with you.
- Surrender your will to the will of the Holy Spirit in all He has revealed. Confess your desire to be to His praise and glory and not man. Ask the Lord to increase your desire for His praise and glory.
- · Repent of specific failings and fear of man that does not honor God.
- Give thanks for the Lord's faithfulness in your life because He is faithful. Give Him praise!

When we testify what we have seen and heard and believed – we proclaim by our action of obedience that we are Jesus radical disciples. This raises our own faith and ignites faith in others to believe the good news. Your witness and testimony is saying, "Do it again Lord, do it again please Lord."

**Spirit.** Put away phones, and anything else that will distract for this time. Bring your thoughts into captivity by setting each worry and every "to do" down at the foot of the cross. Ask the Holy Spirit to convict your heart to see and hear what the Spirit is saying to you.

# Revelation 2:18 –3:1-5 Your Bridegroom...Who has eyes like a flame of fire...Who has the Seven Spirits of God...

Revelation 2:18-28: Church of Thyatira- "The words of the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and whose feet are like burnished bronze. I know your works, your love and faith and service and patient endurance, and that your latter works exceed the first. But...you tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess and is teaching my servants to practice sexual immorality and to eat food sacrificed to idols...she refuses to repent...I will throw her onto a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her I will throw into great tribulation, unless they repent of her works. And I will strike her children dead. And all the churches will know that I am He who searches mind and heart, and I will give to each of you according to your works... To the rest in Thyatira...who do not hold to this teaching, who have not learned what some call the deep things of Satan...I say, I do not lay on you any other burden...hold fast what you have till I come. The one who conquers...who keeps my works until the end...I will give authority over the nations...he will rule them with a rod of iron, as when earthen pots are broken in pieces, even as I myself have received authority from my Father. And I will give him the morning star."

Revelation 3:1-5: Church of Sardis- "The words of Him who has the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your works, you have the reputation of being alive, but you are dead. Wake up, strengthen what remains...about to die...I have not found your works complete in the sight of my God. Remember what you have received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you. Yet you still have a few names...people who have not soiled their garments, and they will walk with Me in white, for they are worthy. The one who conquers will be clothed thus in white garments, and I will never blot his name out of the book of life. I will confess his name before my Father and before His angels."

Re-read the entire chapter: paying close attention to these portions of scripture give special note to what you see and hear in these letters; all that speaks to you.





#### What do I SEE?

SEEING....(The Logos Word). **Write down the general facts of these letters.** Your facts may be a little different than another's, but you are all working from the same passage. Refer back to the scripture portions for clarity...

- What is the description of your Bridegroom in the letter to Thyatira? to Sardis?
- What things did the Lord honor the Churches for doing right?
- How had they fallen short of God's will?
- What judgment did He warn that would be meted out if there was no repentance?
- What was His exhortation to the faithful?

What was the promise?

#### What do I HEAR?

HEARING....(The Rhema Word) **There is a personal word in these letters spoken to you by the Holy Spirit.** It is a call to repentance, obedience and worship. Revelation happens as we submit to the Holy Spirit.

- What personal word is the Holy Spirit speaking to you in His description of Jesus?
- Can you relate to these letters in society today?
- How does this portion of scripture encourage you to stay faithful?
- Are you personally hearing the promises made to the faithful in these churches?
- How do you personally respond to the warning of justice and to the promise of blessing from the Lord in these letters?



This is a personal time to reflect and respond to what you have seen and heard. Take time to consider and write out your thoughts and feelings here. God's Word reveals our hearts to us if we let
Him. The scriptures provoke us to search our hearts and see if there be any wicked
way to lead us in His way everlasting.



The Holy Spirit wants you to be discerning in your world; to be spotless brides ready for the bridegroom. You must choose to respond... or not. We need to be intentional...JESUS WAS. Believing is moving from Logos (knowledge of the general Word) to Rhema (hearing the living, confronting, revealing, personal Word to you); Choosing to actively live out, in faith, what you see and hear from the Holy Spirit, by your obedience.

Obedience is Radical Discipleship. That's what following Jesus requires. Because this is what you saw and heard the Lord say, you choose to respond by obedience to His revealed will; to be His bride.

Now take some time and pray with a partner or two. Pray about what the Holy Spirit has revealed to you and HOW you choose to commit to take personal action.

Praying together – committing to pray for one another – gives you support and makes you accountable to one another before the throne of God.


- Worship God who is your Father, who loves you and Jesus who died for your sins and the Holy Spirit who is your counselor and teacher, turning you to Jesus.

Your Bridegroom The Holy and True One,
Who has the Key of David...

Pevelation Chapter Three
Lesson 4

**Begin with Prayer-** Quiet your heart and mind praying for the Holy Spirit to be the only voice you hear as you meditate on these last two letters. **Settle yourself and ask the Spirit to give you peace of mind and heart to hear and respond to Jesus.** 

- I. Share with your group how you radically obeyed all the Holy Spirit shared with you from last week's lesson.
- II. Read Revelation chapter 3 a few times. This helps to awaken your senses to the Holy Spirit.

# Revelation 3:7-22 Your Bridegroom The Holy and True One, Who has the Key of David...

Revelation 3:7-12: Church of Philadelphia-"The words of the Holy One, the True One, who has the key of David, who opens and no one will shut, who shuts and no one opens.

I know your works. Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power, and yet you have kept my word and have not denied My Name. Behold, I will make those of the synagogue of Satan who say that they are Jews (believers) and are not, but lie – behold, I will make them come and bow down before your feet, and they will learn that I have loved you. Because you have kept My word about patient endurance, I will keep you from the hour of trial that is coming on the whole world, to try those who dwell on the earth. I am coming soon. Hold fast what you have, so that no one may seize your crown. The one who conquers, I will make him a pillar in the temple of my God. Never shall he go out of it, and I will write on him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down from my God out of heaven, and My own new name. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

III. Re-read this portion of scripture: As you read, focus on what you "see and hear" in this scene.



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#### What do I SEE?

- · What exhortation is given to the faithful ones?

#### What do I HEAR?

HEARING... (THE RHEMA WORD) **The Holy Spirit does speak personally, intimately to you through the word of God.** Ask what He is saying to you and listen for His whisper. Make note of it because this revelation.

- What is the first thing that you notice; that you hear in this letter to the Church of Philadelphia? Why is this important?
- What do you hear in the judgment of those who say they are Jews and are not? How will the Lord used this judgment?
- How does the phrase, "patient endurance" and "hour of trial" alert you?
- Can you hear the encouragement to you, even as He assures you, He is coming soon?

• Listen as you read the promise to "those who fast;" What is the Holy Spirit saying to you?		



Write your thoughts and feelings from this love letter to the overcomers. Go over what you have seen and heard and pour out your heart to the Lord. He has poured out His heart to you in this letter.		



We respond to what we believe with our attitudes and actions. What we truly believe is seen in our choices. It is your time to consider what you have seen and heard; acting on what you say you believe by your obedience to the personal word of the Holy Spirit to you. # Revelation 3:14-22 Your Bridegroom - The Amen, Faithful and True Witness!

Revelation 3:14-22: Church of Laodicea- "The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of God's creation. I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth. For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing, not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. I counsel you to buy from me gold refined in the fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments, so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see. Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent. Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with Me. The one who conquers, I will grant him to sit with Me on My throne, as I also conquered and sat down with my Father on His throne. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

#### What do I HEAR?

HEARING...(The Rhema Word) Listen for the intimately personal word the Holy Spirit is revealing as you see and hear His voice in this letter. Ask to be spiritually sensitive to hear what the Spirit is saying to you.

- What do you hear in the description of Jesus? ("beginning of God's creation" means Jesus was creator)
- · How do you discern your spiritual health as you read the description of Laodecia?
- How do you buy from the Lord the things needed to walk before the Lord?
- Can you hear God's love in the midst of discipline?

How do you cultivate spiritual hearing?

- How do you distinguish Jesus knock on the door of your heart?
- How does your heart respond to the promise of those who Hear His Voice?



<b>Now is your time to respond from your heart.</b> Everything you see and feel. Everything you hear from the Holy Spirit. All of your questions, hopes, revelations, confessions adoration. Look through your responses to what you wrote down in Seeing and Hearing. The Lord is waiting to listen.



**Begin with prayer-** Take time now in prayer, committing your thoughts and the intents of your heart to listen to the Holy Spirit speak to you in the midst of these verses.

- I. Share with your group testimony of how last week's scripture passage impacted you about the bridegroom's coming and how you actively responded in obedience.
- II. Read all of Revelation chapter Four before beginning.

# Revelation Chapter 4:1-11 Your Bridegroom – A Voice like a Trumpet...seated on the Throne

Revelation 4:1-11: "After this I looked, and behold, a door standing open in heaven! And the first voice which I had heard speaking to me like a trumpet, said, "come up here, and I will show you what must take place after this." At once I was in the Spirit, and behold, a throne stood in heaven, with one seated on the throne. And He who sat there had the appearance of jasper and carnelian, and around the throne was a rainbow that had the appearance of an emerald. Around the throne were twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones were twenty four elders, clothed in white garments, with golden crowns on their heads. From the throne came flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and before the throne were burning seven torches of fire, which are the seven spirits of God, and be-fore the throne there was, as it were, a sea of glass, like crystal. And around the throne on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind...each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and within, and day and night they never cease to say,

"Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!"...

The twenty four elders fall down before Him who is seated on the throne and worship Him who lives forever and ever. They cast their crowns before the throne, saying,
"Worthy are You, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power,
For You created all things, and by Your will they existed and were created."

III. Re-read this portion of scripture: Focus on what you "see and hear".



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#### What do I SEE?

Seeing...(The logos Word). Describe the scene. There is so much to see and experience in this portion of scripture about your Bridegroom's Home! (you can also refer back to chapter 1).

- Describe your irst impression as you glimpse heaven; your home to be!
- What do you see as you focused on particulars? All that was happening surrounding the throne?
- Who encircles the Bridegroom?
- What is their continual response and reaction, being in His presence?

#### What do I Hear?

HEARING...(The Rhema Word) What is the Holy Spirit revealing to you in this scene? Listen to the voice of the one calling you up to heaven. Can you hear the worship that resounds? These scriptures are alive and speaking a message to you.

- · What do you hear in the mention of a door?
- How does John describe hearing a voice; and His command?
- Consider all that is happening. The colors, the royalty, the worship. What whisper of the Holy Spirit are you hearing about heaven? What are your spiritual senses taken up with?
- Can you hear worship, melody and sounds, all the senses echoing in your heart? What does this say to you personally?



Now is your time to respond from your heart. Everything you see and feel. Everything you hear from the Holy Spirit. Pour out how this has encouraged your holy imagination; what you have not seen in
the natural butwhat you can know by your spiritual senses.



What we truly believe is proven by our attitudes and actions. Consider what you have seen and heard; What is the Holy Spirit whispering (maybe from one part of one scripture) about choosing and obeying. Reread your journal. Now respond with your will to obey the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

- How is the Holy Spirit prompting you to live beyond what you have been choosing?
- How has this holy scene exhorted you to obey and give true worship to the King?



Jesson 7

Revelation 5:5-14

The Bridegroom-Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David



**Begin with prayer-** Stop in this moment to pray that the Holy Spirit will open the eyes of your heart to see and hear and perceive what He is saying to you in His Word.

- I. Share your testimony of growing in your spiritual senses from last week's beautiful glimpse of your heavenly home with Jesus, your Bridegroom.
- II. Read all of Revelation chapter 5 at least two times before beginning.

# Revelation 5:5-14 The Bridegroom-Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David

"And one of the elders said to me to me, "Weep no more; the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that He can open the scroll and its seven seals." And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain, with seven horns and with seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. And He went and took the scroll from the right hand of Him who was seated on the throne. And when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. And they sang a new song, saying,

"Worthy are you to take the scroll, and to open its seals, For You were slain, and by Your blood, You ransomed people for God, And they shall reign on the earth."

Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice,

"Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, To receive power and wealth and wisdom and might And honor and glory and blessing!"

And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, saying,

"To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb Be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!" And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" and the elders fell down and worshipped."

III. Re-read this portion of scripture: Focus on what you "see and hear."



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#### What do I SEE?

Seeing...(The Logos Word). Describe this heavenly scene; what do you see and perceive. This is listing facts. You may have more or less than others, but they will be similar because they are all coming from the same portion of scripture.

- What encouragement did the elder give to John (and to you)?
- Describe what you imagine when you see the lamb and what he did for His love of you. This is your Bridegroom.
- Picture the scene of the twenty-four elders and living creatures. What are the elements they bring with them before the Bridegroom?

•	Describe how the worship increases?

#### What do I Hear?

HEARING...(The Rhema Word) Read the passage over and listen to the dialogue and description of what happened. The Holy Spirit is speaking. Pray that your spiritual hearing is tuned in to this heavenly scene.

- Listen to all that is going on in this scene; elders, living creatures, myriads of angels, every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth, in the sea... what do you hear?
- Harps and golden bowls of incense, that are prayers of the saints...these are all things that include our speaking, hearing, seeing the beauty of the elements ...all heavenly spiritual senses engaged...what is the Holy Spirit revealing to you?
- The worship is melody and prayer and love...beginning with the elders and living creatures. Then it enlarges and includes all...can you hear it? How do you respond?
- Recite the prayer/worship out loud written in this scene. What is the Holy Spirit revealing to you of your Bridegroom?



Respond to all you have seen and heard; all the Holy Spirit has prompted in your spirit to respond. It could be tears or laughter or scripture or feeling orThese are your heart thoughts; you are learning how to meditate (take in and consider) and to fellowship in the spirit.		



We live out what we truly believe by our actions and attitudes. How is the Holy Spirit prompting your heart to respond in all that you have seen and heard by this beautiful act of love by your Bridegroom?

- Love always responds in kind wanting to give more than has been given. How can you respond in love to your Bridegroom? Ask the Holy Spirit to share with you practical, tangible ways to live out love for the Bridegroom.
- We can live out Heaven's template of golden harps and golden bowls of incense here and now. How will you choose to do this?

•	Have you ever written a love song (or a psalm) to your Bridegroom? Try it.
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Spend time with your prayer partners interceding for one another. Ask for the Holy Spirit to give you boldness and obedience in living out what He has shown you. Give thanks for all He is doing.

- Praise Jesus, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, the Lamb slain for you.
- Ask forgiveness for any hardness of heart that would keep you from obeying all you have seen and heard.
- Ask for freedom of heart and spirit; boldness to be a radical disciple.



Pevelation Chapters Mineteen & Twenty two
Lesson 8

**Begin with prayer-** Quiet your heart and mind. This is time for revelation and reflection in the Word. Don't miss the importance of this time. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you eyes to see and ears to hear...

- I. Share with the group your testimony of obedience (that is counted as worship) from all the Holy Spirit revealed to you last week.
- II. Read all of Revelation chapters 19 and 22 slowly before beginning.

## Revelation 19:6-13, 22:1-7,10 The Marriage of the Lamb is come; Jesus is the Spirit of Prophecy

"Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out,

"Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns.

Let us rejoice and exult and give Him the glory,

For the marriage of the Lamb has come,

And His Bride has made herself ready;

It was granted her to clothe herself

With fine linen, bright and pure"-

For the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints. And the angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb...These are the true words of God...."

#### For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.

"And behold, I am coming soon. Blessed is the one who keeps the words of the prophecy of this book."... And he (the angel) said to me, "Do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near. **Behold, I am coming soon**, bringing my recompense with Me, to repay each one for what he has done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end. Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and they may enter the city by the gates...The Spirit and the Bride say "Come." And let the one who hears say, "Come." And let the one who is thirsty Come; let the one who desires take the water of life without price...

"Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come. Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen.

III. Re-read this portion of scripture: Focus on what you "see and hear."





#### What do I SEE?

Seeing...(The logos Word). List what you see in this portion of scripture; of the Bride, the Bridegroom, the heavenly home, your eternal family...

- Describe the beauty and majesty and wonder of this scene. Compare it to your experience of weddings?
- Righteous deeds being likened to white garments? and a Bride? Describe the picture you see of this.
- Can you imagine prophecy being a person? How would that look? What is His title?
- Why are you encouraged to wash your robes? How do you imagine this?
- Who is linked with the Bride in these final verses? What does that speak to you?
- Picture in your heart the final exhortations of this scene. What do you see of the Bride? The Bridegroom? The Friend of the Bridegroom (Holy Spirit)?

#### What do I Hear?

HEARING...(The Rhema Word) The Holy Spirit is giving revelation about intimate relationship. Read the scripture portion and listen. What word or phrase or thought or scene or portion does this evoke as you listen to what you are reading? Ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you through these scriptures.

- Read out loud the song being sung by the multitude, to experience the importance and impact of the blessing being proclaimed to you, as the Bride. How does it sound to you in your heart?
- "For the fine linen is the righteousness of the saints"; and then... a blessing is given. What do you hear personally? (because this is a blessing and an exhortation to you!)
- What is the warning that you hear and see?
- These final verses are exhortations and declarations that you are to hear. These are written to you. How do you respond?



Respond to all that you have seen and heard in this beautiful description of your marriage to the King of Kings. "The Bride has made herself ready." Take time now to write out what is in your heart. This is part of becoming aware that you are to make yourself ready. It begins in the seeing and hearing and recognizing personally. The Holy Spirit is the friend of the Bridegroom and the Bride. He is the friend who is our counselor and teacher, turning us to the Bridegroom.



### What we truly believe is lived out through our attitudes and actions because of love.

What have you seen and heard; What is the Holy Spirit whispering to you about your future? It begins now! Re-read your journal. Now respond with your will submitted to obey the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

- Respond to what the Holy Spirit is saying with practical ways to "make yourself ready as the Bride."
- · How will you keep the words of the prophecy of this Book?
- Think of the ways the Lord has given you to wash your robes.

How will you join with the Spirit to say "Come" to others who are in need?



Join with others before the throne. Pray for one another in all the Holy Spirit has revealed to you. Praying together makes the time of testimony that much sweeter. Because it encourages faith and celebrates what it means to be the Bride, watching for her Bridegroom.

- Praise the Lamb of God, the sinless sacrifice, who loves you with an everlasting love; your Bridegroom.
- How will you pray to show your love and honor to the Bridegroom who gave everything to win you?
- Give thanks to the Lord of Lord and King of Kings who loves you from eternity past till forever. He is your Bridegroom, Jesus.

Revelation 19:6-13,22:1-7,10



Because you are the chosen Bride, write down how you were obedient in the opportunities that you were given, to show your passionate love for your Bridegroom.

- Love always gives testimony of its actions because this speaks of intimate relationship. And this encourages others either by provoking or prompting them to do the same.
- You love Him because He first loved you. Share how you testified in word and deed your relationship with your Bridegroom.
